



Cabin in the Vines Guesthouse

Our Guesthouse is a lovingly restored antique log cabin dating back to the 1820s. It sits on a beautiful hill overlooking the Cavender Creek Vineyards property, just steps from the Winery and Tasting Room.

The cabin was moved to our site in 2006 from Rogersville, Tennessee, which was settled in 1775 by Joseph Rogers, grandfather of Davy Crockett. After the cabin was disassembled, the logs were loaded onto a flatbed truck and delivered to our Vineyard's property. The former proprietor Raymond Castleberry reconstructed the cabin and supervised the rebuilding of the roof system, porches, chimney, and all of the finishing details that make our cabin unique.

While the intent was to maintain the primitive original structure, the new, improved version has all the modern amenities such as running water, electricity, and even zoned central heating and cooling. Along with the charm of the antique logs and finishes, you will find the Guesthouse very comfortable and, we hope, relaxing.

As you are visiting our Guesthouse, it is important that you to be aware that an antique structure such as this requires more careful use and more gentle handling than the average rental cabin. We trust our Guests to respect the age of the cabin and treat it with appropriate care. (If inspection after your departure reveals any damage to the property or any missing items, you can be held liable for the cost of full repair or replacement.)

It is also important that we point out that our cabin sits right between a working farm and a working winery with a tasting room. Therefore, there may be unusual noises caused by our tractor, mowers, donkeys, roosters, or our two guard dogs. Tasting room guests will be passing in close proximity to the cabin on their way to the tasting room. However, we have plenty of signs posted to keep customers away from your private cabin area. We don't think you will find these noises objectionable, and hope that you will enjoy being "involved" in the day-to-day operation of our vineyard and winery.

If you do choose to bring your dog to the cabin (we cannot allow cats), you must keep a close eye on your dog at all times. We have two guard dogs that live on our property, and while we have not had problems with them interacting with other dogs we do ask that you take responsibility for your dog while on our property.

We do provide free Wi-Fi service, but we have chosen not to include TV in the Guesthouse. Bring a good book or some games to play while enjoying good company and even better Cavender Creek wines!

Underage drinking is not permitted on our property. If you have people in your group

that are under the age of 21, they cannot drink while staying in our cabin in the vines. There is no smoking on our property except for in the gravel parking lot, please respect and adhere to this policy.

To reserve the Guesthouse, we require a deposit to hold your reservation. This will be the cost of one night's stay in our cabin. The deposit is non-refundable if you cancel within two weeks (14 days) of your reservation. Upon arrival, the remainder of the bill is due, this can be paid when you come to the tasting room to pick up your keys. On top of the nightly fee for the cabin, which covers utility usage and cleaning costs, we are required to charge state sales tax and county hotel tax.

Check in is at 3 PM on the day of your arrival, and check out is at 12 PM on the day of your departure. You may request a change in these times, and we will do our best to accommodate you.
